Inquiry Requirement (3 cr.)

One course in educational inquiry methodology, usually EDUC-Y 520: Strategies for Educational Inquiry [Summer availability], selected with the ICE program advisor.

Concentration Requirement (9 cr.)

9 Graduate-level credits in International Studies from the College of Arts & Sciences – Hamilton Lugar School for Global & International Studies can double count toward the undergraduate and graduate degrees, thereby fulfilling the International and Comparative Education (ICE) Master's Concentration. The International Studies courses will complement the study of comparative and international education. INTL-I 521 is required, INTL-I 520 is recommended, and the student selects the remaining course in consultation with the advisor.

The following courses from International Studies (INTL-I) include:

INTL-I 521: Global Governance and International Institutions (required) (3 cr.)

INTL-I 520: History of International Institutions (recommended) (3 cr.)

INTL-I 503: Seminar in International Development (or other INTL graduate elective) (3 cr.).

Other electives can be selected from INTL I-500, I-502, I-503, I-504, I-505, I-506, or I-510 topics, INTL I-524 (Practicum in International Policy Analysis), or other 500-level INTL classes with approval of the INTL Director of Graduate Studies.
